CHANGE #1

Section 3.2f, was changed from:

f. Probationary

To read:

f. Junior

CHANGE #2

Section 3.6d was added:

d. Must be a Member in good standing prior to 1 January 2020.

CHANGE #3

Section 3.11 was added:

3.11 Junior Member

In order to become a Junior Club Member, the candidate's parent or legal guardian shall submit a request to the Club Membership Committee.

The candidate:

- a. must be either:
 - 1. the child of a Club Member in good standing, or
 - 2. under the Legal Guardianship of a Club Member in good standing.,
- b. must be no more than 18 years of age,
- c. shall not be required to pay dues,
- d. shall not hold Club Office,
- e. shall not be a Member of any Club Committee,
- f. shall not hold any Club keys or Club access card,
- g. shall not vote on any Club issue or office,
- h. shall be supervised by parent or guardian at all times while on Club property, and
- i. may participate in Club Leagues and events when accompanied by parent or legal guardian.
- After being a Junior Club Member for one full year and attaining 18 years of age, the Junior Member may be submitted for Regular Membership by their parent or legal guardian, without need of Club Sponsor, at any monthly Members Meeting.
 - 1. They must attend a Club Orientation session and successfully complete the Range Safety Test with a Club Range Safety Officer, before being issued a Club key card and being allowed to use Club range facilities.
 - 2. Dues shall not be required until the next calendar year following their 18th birthday.

CHANGE #4

Section 13.1, was changed from:

13.1 Notice of all proposed amendments and revisions to the Constitution and Bylaws shall be outlined in detail in the Club newsletter to be mailed or published no later than ten (10) days before the monthly meeting.

to read:

- 13.1 Prior to any vote on proposed amendments or revisions to the Constitution and Bylaws, the proposal shall be drafted in detail, and:
 - a. be presented to the Board of Directors at a monthly BOD Meeting,
 - b. subsequently be presented to the Members at a regular monthly Club Meeting,
 - c. shall then be printed, in its entirety, along with the submitter's name, in the Club newsletter, to be mailed or published no later than ten (10) days before the next monthly meeting, whereupon it shall be submitted to the Members in attendance for a vote as printed.
 - d. Grammatical, spelling, reference, and typographic errors, found in the Constitution and Bylaws, may be corrected with the approval of the Board of Directors, without any further action required.

As the Club Approaches 120

As CPF&G Club nears the ripe old age of 120, it's important to take a moment to reflect on the valuable resource we have in our possession and now under our stewardship. The club's founders started with an old piece of farm and woodland alongside a railroad track. Pond Street, if it even had a name back then, was just an old dirt road with few homes along it, leading down to a remote pond. In 1903, the range being a mile or so out in the woods from the Main Road, now Rte, 108, was far from homes and neighborhoods. Deep in the woods, nobody was bothered by the sound of gunfire. It was a different time back then.

As the years passed, what some might call progress has crept very close to this property. The range is now surrounded by abutters with homes on all sides of the club's boundary lines. Some homes today are only separated from the club's property line by the railroad right of way or the narrow paved road running past the club. Others are direct abutters to the property. Not too many years ago, we saw new houses built directly across the street from the range property. Are these homeowners in favor of this organization in their back yard or not? I don't know, but I could probably fathom a guess.

What I am getting at is this. We have something very special here by today's zoning standards. If our club's property were nothing but a vacant lot, what do you think the chances would be, for a group of say, 850 likeminded people (today's membership) to go out and buy this same acreage here on Pond Street, assuming they could afford it, and build a shooting range? The "NOT IN MY BACKYARD" signs would probably go up overnight, all over town. Gun ranges like this, in this part of the country, are a dying entity. As the current stewards of this special piece of real estate, we must remain careful, vigilant, and considerate to the varied efforts and neighbors around us, who may want

nothing more than to shut this and all gun clubs down for good.

Our club on Pond Street is as fragile as the 2nd Amendment, and we, as members, must continue to be good stewards, not only for future members that continue to join us at nearly every monthly meeting, but for the promotion of safe shooting sports in general. CPF&G Club has had very good leadership over the years, with many members who have worked hard to continue to protect what we have, for the enjoyment of other fellow members. We must also continue our individual responsibility as members, of being good supporters of the 2nd amendment, by practicing safe and responsible gun ownership, by being good neighbors, and by following the club's rules for engagement of this sport we practice, while on the range property. If the club were ever forced to close due to either lack of interest or any external, opposing, or coalition

force, I submit we would probably never get it back again.

As the club approaches 120 years old, respect what we have here. Remember the hundreds of members before us, who founded and built this club, and who helped make it what it is today, for our use and enjoyment. Enjoy the ranges, and support the club in any way you can, not just for today, but for the future of the yet unknown fellow members, who will one day join us and take over the responsibilities of managing this club, and for the future and continued promotion of safe shooting sports in general. Become a member of the NRA and local pro-gun organizations like GO-NH (Gun Owners of New Hampshire), who work every day to support our right to own firearms and continue to have the privilege to come and enjoy the sport of shooting on this special piece of real estate we call Country Pond Fish & Game Club. God Bless America!



Centerfire Pistol League





This year, the Country Pond Fish & Game Club Centerfire Pistol League, open to all members, starts on 29 January and finishes on 25 March.

The league is at the same time as the rimfire league – Wednesdays from 1700 to 2000. It will convene for seven nights with the last session this year on March 25. The last night is "Fun Shoot" with pizza and awards. However there will be no shooting on Wednesday, 12 February, which is the night of the rimfire league banquet

Three targets are shot each night: ten shots in 10 minutes for Slow Fire, five shots in 20 seconds for Timed Fire - shot twice, five shots in 10 seconds for Rapid Fire - also shot twice. The Rapid Fire stage is different form past years. Previously, we've shot it the same as Timed Fire.

As far as firearms are concerned, we have few restrictions. If you want to use a different one each week that's fine. Changing firearms during a

session however it not allowed. Finally, Club rules regarding caliber sizes that are allowed obviously apply.

It is a participant's choice as to whether they shoot one handed or two handed, and this is not tracked.



The last night is a "fun night" and no scores are kept. We traditionally do different activities like shooting at backward targets, small stickers on regular targets and things like that. Any ideas that participants have in this regard would be welcome. We also do pizza on the last night and have some awards. Last year we awarded .22 and 9mm ammo for high average in the various categories – Slow Fire, Timed Fire, Rapid Fire, and Overall Average.

We did this for optical sights and iron sights as separate categories.

We will again use the spreadsheet that Piney put together. With that spreadsheet, results will be posted on our website instead of being sent by email. I also want to adopt the same rule that the rimfire league did – basically if you are shooting twice in one night, you can't sign up for consecutive relays.

Finally, unlike the Rimfire League we will not have teams or calculated handicaps. We will not be having a separate meeting this year but will just have a general discussion on our first night. This year Andy Gaunt will be helping out with the league. It is great to have good help.

Finally, if you know that you will participate, please email me at jamesfgraczyk@gmail.com and let me know. I want to do as much preparation of the record keeping as possible ahead of time.

The legislative session for 2020 has kicked off with a bang. Our House of Representatives has passed the "Red Flag" bill and is sending it on to the Senate. Both our legislative houses are controlled by Democrats. Once again, we must rely on the Governor's veto to stop bad legislation.

There are approximately 1,000 bills being drafted. At least 80 are related to guns, including three that were vetoed last year: Requiring background checks for commercial firearms sales (A great deal will depend on the legislatures definition of "commercial sales".), imposing a waiting period between the purchase and delivery of a firearm, and prohibiting guns on school property. Supporters argue that while no single law will solve the problem of gun violence (they know these proposed laws will not stop a criminal, so they are preparing to expand the laws before they are even passed) the state should take steps toward that goal. Governor Sununu stated in his veto message last year, "Our state ranks as one of the nation's safest and existing gun laws fit New Hampshire's culture of responsible gun ownership and individual freedom".

The new bills related to guns include one that would allow the state to destroy firearms that are voluntarily surrendered. Current law requires them to be sold at public auction or kept by state agencies for their own use. Other bills would require locking devices to be provided with commercial firearms sales (anyone bought a new firearm lately that doesn't come with a lock?) and to prohibit the manufacture, sale or possession of large capacity ammunition feeding devices. They also want to create a committee to study gun incidents involving children. (sounds like Massachusetts thinking)

Our pro-firearm organizations have been active since day one of the new session. The Gun Owners of NH, the NH Firearm Coalition, and other freedom loving groups have already addressed the "Gun Violence" onslaught coming at us full bore. We are going to need your support to once again fight for our firearm rights. This

is a Presidential election year and it's going to be a very busy one.

The only way we are going to come to a consensus that will cease all this feel good legislation and the people who favor such frivolity is by taking back the legislative process. The Heritage Foundation sent me some information and ideas to accomplish our goals starting at the national level:

- With America's students falling further behind, we should ensure every family can tailor their children's education. (Children are not taught their Constitutional rights, therefore they are willing to give them up.)
- America is a great nation because its government is carefully balanced so that no one person or group has too much power. To ensure that balance





remains, there must be targeted reforms that focus the federal (and state) government on its primary obligations and restore accountability to VOTERS.

We are at a crossroad for our future and the future of our children. The PC BS must be stopped if we as Americans are going to enjoy the freedoms fought and paid for over many years. The national, state, and local levels of government need to heed what the voters of this country want and need. Something that is not happening today! Here is a list of the House Bill numbers if you want to do the research:

HB1509, HB1660, and LSR2733 - New Red Flag bills targeting specific groups of people

HB1101 - Mandatory waiting periods. HB1115 and SB469 - shutdown NH Shooting Ranges Act and Range Closure

HB1143 - eliminates liability protections for manufacturers, dealers and distributors of firearms.

HB1285 - gun free school zones. HB1374 - allowing taxpayer funds to pay for government to buy your firearms and destroy them. HB1379 - Banning the Private Sale of

Firearms Act. HB1608 - limiting magazine capacity.

Local and state primaries will be here before you know it. Make sure the candidates you choose will protect your rights and protect the rights of your children to live as free Americans.
