.22 RIMFIRE PLATE **SHOOTS**

We started our 2008-09 .22 Plate Shoot season with a bang - we had 34 shooters at our November 9th match. Unfortunately, with so many shooters. we only had time to shoot one match. The program has been re-formatted to alleviate that problem.

Previously, a match consisted of three relays of five stations per relay. Starting this month, each match will be two relays of five stations. The match will be shot in squads, limited to 15 shooters. Each squad will be able to complete the match in about 55 minutes, so a new squad will shoot every hour. Squads will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.

The matches are open to the general public. All guns chambered in .22 Short, Long, or Long Rifle may be used, regardless of type or sights. Registration is from 11:00 to 11:45am, and the first match of the day starts at Club money (more than \$5,000 per

noon. Cost per shooter for your first match of the day is \$5.00 for CPF&G members and \$8.00 for non-members. Juniors (under 16) shoot for free with a paid adult. Cost for additional matches shot on the same day is \$3.00 each for everyone (Juniors still shoot free).

The kitchen will be open for food and drinks from 11:30am to around 2:30pm.

The remaining matches this season will be held February 8th, March 1st, and April 5th. Hope to see you there!

POLITICAL NOTES

Federal: Obviously the inauguration of our new President on January 20th is going to have a great impact on our Second Amendment rights and all our rights under the Constitution of the United States of America. His choice of Mr. Holder as United States Attorney General tells us a great deal about Mr. Obama's pledge to support our rights.

I reported on Mr. Holder's record in the Justice Department during Janet Reno's rein as Attorney General last month. One of Mr. Holder's now famous (read infamous) quotes: "The Second Amendment does not protect firearms possession or use unrelated to participation in a well-regulated militia." He repeated this declaration of war on our Second Amendment rights after the Supreme Court's Heller decision. Here we go!

The U.S. Department of the Interior (DOI), through the National Park

Service and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, announced the final amended version of its changes to rules on carrying of firearms in national parks and wildlife refuges. DOI's move will restore the rights of law-abiding gun owners who wish to transport and carry firearms for lawful purposes on most DOI lands, and will make federal law consistent with state law in which these public lands are located. We are facing many challenges to our Constitutional rights when the new administration gets rolling. As many times as I have written about it and spoken about it at our regular meeting. our events and whenever someone will listen our community of gun-owners does not realize the importance of joining and supporting organizations such as the National Rife Association, Gun Owners of America, Gun Owners of New Hampshire and the Gun Owners Action League Massachusetts.

We are going to be in the political fight of our lives in the very near future. These groups are our advocates in the political arena. Playing and winning "politics" in Washington D.C., is a very expensive proposition. We need to put our support and finances behind these organizations our we will be putting our rifles, shotguns and pistol into the confiscation bins at the local, state and federal law enforcement agencies. 
