

Each match will be two relays of five stations. The match will be shot in squads, limited to 15 shooters. Each squad will be able to complete the match in about 55 minutes, so a new squad will shoot every hour. Squads will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.

The matches are open to the general public. All guns chambered in .22 Short, Long, or Long Rifle may be used, regardless of type or sights. Registration is from 11:00 to 11:45am, and the first match of the day starts at noon. Cost per shooter for your first match of the day is \$5.00 for CPF&G members and \$8.00 for non-members. Juniors (under 16) shoot for free with a paid adult. Cost for additional matches shot on the same day is \$3.00 each for everyone (Juniors still shoot free).

POLITICAL NOTES

Federal: This should not be a surprise to any gun owners who have not had their heads in the sand since last November. President Obama wants to reinstate President Clinton's semiauto ban and add hundreds of firearms to the list to be banned.

As for President Obama's Vice President Joe Biden he recently bragged that "I'm the guy who originally wrote the assault weapons ban."

Speaker of the House Nancy Pelosi has also voted for the assault weapons ban. She has said that the Democrats will revisit guns "when the issue is ripe." Translation – when we have control of both houses we will ban all the firearms we can.

Eric Holder, the Attorney General of the United States, has stated that "Americans are a nation of cowards when it comes to racism."

Now you know what the top political figures in our country think of firearms and the every day people (YOU AND ME) of the United States.

Now doesn't that give you a warm and fuzzy feeling about our future?

New Hampshire: HB 160 Personal Protection Act – Do you know, under current New Hampshire law, you are not allowed to defend yourself if you are in a public place? In order for you

to use deadly force to defend yourself, you must make a split second decision. Is the attacker "about to use deadly force" or "committing or about to commit a kidnapping or forcible sex offence"? You must be able to prove to police that you could not have safely retreated from the situation, or it will be you who goes to jail.

House Bill 160 fixes the current law by saying that you may use deadly force in defense of your life "in any place you have a right to be." No one should use deadly force unless they have to! No one should go to jail for justifiably using deadly force to defend oneself.

Massachusetts: Gun Owners Action League reports a new piece of legislation filed by Representative William Lantiqua of Lawrence to criminalize the possession of a rifle, shotgun or handgun with an expired license. ATTENTION CENTER FIRE PISTOL SHOOTERS

LATE WINTER IS HERE, AND THAT MEANS THE CPF&G CENTERFIRE PISTOL LEAGUE IS READY TO BEGIN FOR THE 2009 SEASON.

The first match is currently scheduled for

Wednesday March 11th from 6 to 8 pm

(Range is open earlier for practice)

The course of fire will be a modified NRA Gallery match consisting of 3 stages of 10 shots each: slow, timed, and rapid fire, all at a distance of 50 feet.

The modifications are:

- 1. Shooting position may be two handed (Traditionalists will still be using the offhand position)
- 2. The rapid fire stage will be 20 seconds

This is a very informal league, primarily for fun, and to allow any shooters of any skill to come and shoot with other center fire shooters, exchange ideas and techniques and improve their skill.

We keep score, but only so you can see if you are improving as the league progresses. There are no winners or losers, just shooting buddies.

There are no teams so if you can't come some nights, it doesn't matter.

EQUIPMENT: Ear & eye protection

Any Club legal caliber pistol or revolver (no .460, .480, .500, etc.) of .32 caliber up, with any type of sights.

Since we are only punching paper, and low recoil will help you during the timed and rapid fire stages, light cartridge loads are recommended.

Typically hot coffee and donut holes will be available each night.

We probably will run the league about 8 or 10 weeks depending on how the members vote. The typical fee will be in the \$3 to \$4 range, just to cover expenses.


UP DATED DATES DUE TO SNOW CLOSURES
