COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING MATCHES

Howdy Folks!

Cowboy Action Shooting (CAS) is all about dressin' up like folks did in the Old West and shootin' guns that were commonly used back then.

The targets are steel plates, and they're pretty big and pretty close, so expert marksmanship is NOT required. We set up our matches so that every shooter, regardless of experience, can hit every target. Winners are determined by just how quickly they hit those targets.

Our matches are pretty easy – we don't try to compete so much as have a good time. Havin' a good time, along with being SAFE, are two rules that we strictly enforce.

As far as dressin' up, we're not terribly formal about that, but dressin' up is half the fun! All you really need is pair of jeans, a long-sleeved shirt, a cowboy style hat, and boots. The only things that we really insist on are: No Baseball-style Caps, No Sneakers, No Short-Sleeve Shirts, and No Nylon, Web, or Velcro Gear. They just didn't have any of that stuff in the 1800s.

We use firearms that were available prior to 1899 - originals or replicas. You'll need two single-action six-guns, a lever-action rifle (in pistol caliber only), and a double-barrel or exposed-hammer pump shotgun. If you don't have the right guns, don't worry, most of the regular shooters are willin' to lend firearms to new shooters that haven't got the proper ones, just so they can get the hang of it. That's how I got started in this – I didn't have any of the right equipment, but one of the regular cowhands loaned me a complete setup and, a few hours later, I was hooked! A lot of us bring extra guns and ammo just in case someone shows up and wants to try this game on for size.

To shoot a match at CPF&G, you'll need about 60 rounds each of pistol and rifle ammo, and a 25-round box of shotgun shells. Both rifle and pistol ammo must be pistol caliber (.45 Colt,

.44 Special, .38 Special, etc.) LEAD bullets only – no jacketed or rifle caliber ammo allowed – and all ammo should be mild field or target loads (it doesn't take much to make a steel plate go "Ding!" from 25 feet away). Shotshells must be size 7 ½ or smaller LEAD shot. If you're borrowin' guns from someone, you can probably borrow some ammo as well.

Our matches are divided into six "Stages". Each stage is a different course of fire, and each stage has a "Scenario" to go with it. The scenario is a short storyline that explains why each stage is set up the way it is. A typical scenario might start out with "You're in the saloon playin' poker when in walk two hombres with fire in their eyes..."

We shoot three stages, break for lunch, then shoot three more stages.

The stages and scenarios are different for each match. They're posted in advance on Piney Woods' website, at www.pineywoodsplace.com/cpfgrcas.html. There are also links on that page that lead to all kinds of information about this game and how we play it here at CPF&G. Results are posted in the same place within a day or two after the match.

This year we'll be hosting six CAS matches at CPF&G. We held our first one on April 12th, when we had "The Great Easter Bunny Hunt". Our remaining 2009 matches will be held on August 9th, September 20th, and October 11th. Match Registration is from 10:30 to 11:45, followed by a mandatory safety meeting. The actual match starts at high noon, and we're usually done by 4:30. As far as cost goes: it's \$5.00 for CPF&G Members, \$10.00 for non-members, and Juniors (under 16) shoot FREE.

We feel our match is the perfect place to come out and experience what CAS is all about. Once you've tried it you'll be hooked! The folks here are a

friendly bunch and no matter what your skill level you're welcome to come join us! POLITICAL NOTES

Federal: Senators Mike Crapo, R-Idaho and Patrick Leahy, D-Vt., introduced S.941 – the “Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives Reform and Firearms Modernization Act.” Sen. Leahy is chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee, which has jurisdiction over the bill. A companion bill, H.R.2296, was introduced in the House by Reps. Steve King, R-Iowa and Zack Space, D-Ohio.

S.941 represents the first time such BATFE reform legislation has been introduced in the Senate. However, the House passed similar legislation (H.R.5092) in the 109th Congress by a 277-131 vote. A majority of the House – 244 lawmakers – cosponsored a similar bill (H.R.4900) in the 110th Congress. This bipartisan reform

legislation is the culmination of efforts to address BATFE abuses and problems.

The Obama administration announced its support for Senate ratification of an inter-American treaty on firearm trafficking. The NRA issued the following statement: “The NRA is well aware of the proposed Organization of American States treaty on firearm trafficking known by its Spanish initials as CIFTA.”

“The treaty does include language suggesting that it is not intended to restrict lawful ownership and use of firearms. Despite those words, the NRA knows that anti-gun advocates will still try to use this treaty to attack gun ownership in the U.S. Therefore, the NRA will continue to vigorously oppose any international effort to restrict the constitutional rights of law-abiding American gun owners.” (Sources: Chris Cox, NRA/ILA & Wayne LaPierre Exec. VP NRA.

New Hampshire: Some of our politicians in Concord passed an eleventh hour amendment to the NH state budget (HB 1 & HB2). The intent

is to jack up the cost of non-resident pistol licenses a whopping 500%. They think as long as they don't touch the resident license fees, their constituents won't get upset. How long do you think that will last in a cash-strapped state if they think they can get away with this kind of stuff in the eleventh hour on pending legislation? Please contact your state reps and let them know we will protect all gun-owners rights. (Source: NH Firearms Coalition)

Massachusetts: The powers that be have petitioned the Mass. Supreme Judicial Court to review a lower court ruling that dismissed charges against a man for not securing firearms in the home. The firearms in question are for self defense and as we all know an unloaded firearm is a fancy paperweight. The lower court dismissed the case citing recent Second Amendment rulings in our nation's capitol (Heller). Let's see what happens with this one.
