COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING MATCHES

Howdy Folks!

Cowboy Action Shooting (CAS) is all about dressin' up like folks did in the Old West and shootin' guns that were commonly used back then.

The targets are steel plates, and they're pretty big and pretty close, so expert marksmanship is NOT required. We set up our matches so that every shooter, regardless of experience, can every target. Winners are determined by just how quickly they hit those targets.

Our matches are pretty easy - we don't try to compete so much as have a good time. Havin' a good time, along with being SAFE, are two rules that we strictly enforce.

As far as dressin' up, we're not terribly formal about that, but dressin' up is half the fun! All you really need is pair of jeans, a long-sleeved shirt, a cowboy style hat, and boots. The only things that we really insist on are: No Baseball-style Caps, No Sneakers, No Short-Sleeve Shirts, and No Nylon, Web, or Velcro Gear. They just didn't have any of that stuff in the 1800s.

We use firearms that were available prior to 1899 - originals or replicas. You'll need two single-action six-guns, a lever-action rifle (in pistol caliber only), and a double-barrel or exposedhammer pump shotgun. If you don't have the right guns, don't worry, most of the regular shooters are willin' to lend firearms to new shooters that haven't got the proper ones, just so they can get the hang of it. That's how I got started in this – I didn't have any of the right equipment, but one of the regular cowhands loaned complete setup and, a few hours later, I was hooked! A lot of us bring extra guns and ammo just in case someone shows up and wants to try this game on for size.

To shoot a match at CPF&G, you'll need about 60 rounds each of pistol and rifle ammo, and a 25-round box of shotgun shells. Both rifle and pistol ammo must be pistol caliber (.45 Colt, .44 Special, .38 Special, etc.) LEAD bullets only – no jacketed or rifle caliber ammo allowed – and all ammo should be mild field or target loads (it doesn't take much to make a steel plate go "Ding!" from 25 feet away). Shotshells must be size 7 ½ or smaller LEAD shot. If you're borrowin' guns from someone, you can probably borrow some ammo as well.

Our matches are divided into six "Stages". Each stage is a different course of fire, and each stage has a "Scenario" to go with it. The scenario is a short storyline that explains why each stage is set up the way it is. A typical scenario might start out with "You're in the saloon playin' poker when in walk two hombres with fire in their eyes…"

We shoot three stages, break for lunch, then shoot three more stages.

The stages and scenarios are different for each match. They're posted in advance on Piney Woods' website,

www.pineywoodsplace.com/cpfgcas.ht ml. There are also links on that page that lead to all kinds of information about this game and how we play it here at CPF&G. Results are posted in the same place within a day or two after the match.

This year we'll be hosting six CAS matches at CPF&G. We held our first one on April 12th, when we had "The Great Easter Bunny Hunt". Our remaining 2009 matches will be held on August 9th, September 20th, and October 11th. Match Registration is from 10:30 to 11:45, followed by a mandatory safety meeting. The actual

match starts at high noon, and we're usually done by 4:30. As far as cost goes: it's \$5.00 for CPF&G Members, \$10.00 for non-members, and Juniors (under 16) shoot FREE.

We feel our match is the perfect place to come out and experience what CAS is all about. Once you've tried it you'll be hooked! The folks here are a friendly bunch and no matter what your skill level you're welcome to come join us! POLITICAL NOTES

Federal: There are more schemes being hatched in Washington D.C. to undermine our Second Amendment rights than there are weeds in my backyard. The Obama Administration, despite their adamant protestations that citizens of the United States did not have to fear a gun grabbing government, has once again failed to live up to campaign promises. Obama's appointments to the Justice Department, the Department of State, Homeland Security and the BATFE should have opened the eyes and raised the blood pressure levels of every gun owner in this great country of ours.

We are in for the fight of our lives if we plan to legally own firearms by the end of Obama's first and hopefully only term as President of the United States. A prime example this month is his nomination for the Supreme Court. If you had the opportunity to watch or listen to her confirmation hearing you know what I am writing about. Just as we have learned, on a small scale the importance of impartial judges (NH Supreme Court), the fact that the law as written was totally in our favor we still needed the courts to rule on our situation. What do you think will happen when Second Amendment issues come before a liberal leaning, biased U.S. Supreme Court?

New Hampshire: Things are relatively quiet in the Granite State. There has been a lot of posturing by some state politicians but there has not been anything of substance proposed currently.

Massachusetts: GOAL of Mass., has reported on proposed regulations to close public access to firearms training education. The proposed regulations would affect any events clubs might have involve nonmembers possibly including junior shooting programs, Women on Target, Becoming an Outdoors Woman, First Step, state required training courses, the Mass Outdoor Expo, trap and range days where a club might charge a nonmember fee, etc.

The regulations would also end any events open to the public in regards to machine guns. One of the proposed regulations is as follows: Section 15.03 Firearms Exhibition Requirements – d) Ensure that one certified firearms safety instructor is present at the exhibition for every 20 members of the public present general at exhibition; provided however, if persons under the age of 18 are to be admitted to a firearms exhibition, there shall be one firearms safety instructor present for every five individuals present at the exhibition. The certified firearms safety instructor(s) present at the exhibition SHALL BE DIRECTLY RESPONSIBLE for the instruction, supervision and safety of members of the general public participating in the regulated shooting during the firearms exhibition. In my opinion that translates to the instructor being criminally and civilly responsible for any and all mishaps.
