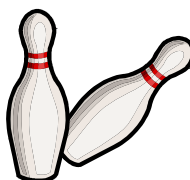

Political Notes

FEDERAL

The atmosphere in Washington, DC is enough to scare the daylights out of anyone who doesn't have his head in the sand. Here is a sample of the insanity currently occupying our legislators.

A binational task force on US - Mexico border issues has requested the Obama administration to reinstate an expired ban on assault weapons and for Mexico to overhaul its frontier police and custom agencies to mirror the US Department of Homeland Security.

In Mexico City in April, Obama pledged to push the Senate to ratify an inter-American arms trafficking treaty. Mexican officials want a ban, saying that 90 percent of guns seized in Mexican drug crimes and submitted for tracing to the BATFE originate in the US, including most assault rifles. The annual reports published by the government DO NOT confirm this figure.

The Affordable Health Care Choices Act of 2009 (*Obama Care*)

Michael Connelly, a retired attorney, has read the entire act.

Excerpts of his analyses follow:

Much of what has been said about the law and its implications are in fact true. The law does provide for rationing of health care, free health care for illegal immigrants, free abortion services, and probably forced participation in abortions by members of the medical profession. I have concluded that this legislation really has no intention of providing affordable health care choices. Instead it is a convenient cover for the most massive transfer of power to the Executive Branch of government that has ever occurred, or even been contemplated. If this law or a similar one is adopted, major portions of the Constitution of the United States will effectively have been destroyed.

NEW HAMPSHIRE

Gun Owners of New Hampshire, our state organization, is monitoring about 30 state legislative proposals that could be adverse to our firearm rights in the Granite State. Our Democrat controlled house is having a field day trying to force our state into a broad based tax to support their spending agenda. One of the things they are attempting to slip through while we are fighting to keep the New Hampshire advantage is a slew of restrictions on our firearms right. GONH will be ever vigilant in keeping us informed and prepared to fight any adverse legislation they try to force upon the firearm owners of New Hampshire. (Source: GONH)

Notice: Members who purchase thru the Club will be responsible for an additional \$20 charge if products are shipped to the Club by FED/EX. Check to see how they ship and ask for UPS or USPS.

There is a form available at the club for this purpose. If this data is not included, the firearm will be returned to the sender. There is a \$10.00 charge for receiving these firearms.

.22 Rimfire Plate Shoots

We kicked off the 2009-10 22 Plate Shoot season on November 8th with 29 shooters and balmy 70 degree weather. The word's gotten around - we have a great time at these matches!

Participants use .22 Rimfire (non-Magnum) guns, but that's where the similarities end. Shooters use scope-sighted heavy-barreled rifles with 24X scopes, iron-sighted revolvers, and everything in between. We've seen open sights, aperture sights, red-dots, and scopes. We have separate classes for type of gun and type of sights, so bolt action rifles with scopes don't shoot against revolvers with iron sights.

We shoot three or four relays at each match. One complete relay consists of two rotations of five stations, with eight targets per station, for a total of 80 shots. The targets vary from 2 1/2" to 6" in diameter, and are shot offhand at 25 yards. Shooters have 15 seconds to knock over their eight targets, and the winner is the shooter with the most hits at the end of the match.

The big prize... *Braggin' Rights!*

Matches are open to the general public and we typically shoot three or four relays per match. Registration starts at 11:00, and we start shooting at noon. Cost per shooter for their first relay is \$5.00 for Country Pond members and \$10.00 for non-members. The cost for second, third, or fourth relays shot the same day is \$3.00 each for everyone.

Our next match will be on December 13th. We shoot on the outdoor range, regardless of the weather, so warm clothing and handwarmers will likely be a good bet. If it gets too cold, there's an enclosed heated area to warm up between relays.

Juniors always shoot for free and may shoot from a rest if they wish. The kitchen is open for food and drinks from noon to around 14:00.

The remaining match dates this season are December 13th, January 10th, February 14th, March 14th, and April 4th.

Hope to see you there!

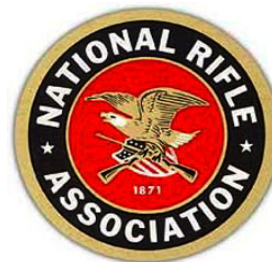
