

NH Politics & Legislation

There are several proposed bills that are very interesting for gun owners. Here are two of them.

HB 330: An act relative to carrying firearms.

This bill permits any person to carry a firearm, openly or concealed, loaded or unloaded, on or about their person or upon or in a vehicle, whether or not such person possesses a license, permit, or other authorization to carry a firearm.

Removes the requirement that non-residents obtain a license to possess a firearm while in New Hampshire.

The selectmen of a town or the mayor or chief of police of a city or some full-time police officer designated by them respectively, upon application of any resident of such town or city shall issue a license to such applicant authorizing the applicant to carry a loaded pistol or revolver in this for not less than 4 years from the date of issue, if it appears that the applicant has GOOD REASON to fear injury to the applicant's person or property or has any proper purpose, and that the applicant is a suitable person to be licensed. Hunting, target shooting, or self-defense shall be considered a proper purpose.

The reason for this section of the bill is for reciprocity with other jurisdictions. There are flaws in this legislation (capitalized) which will hopefully be corrected in committee.

House Bill 536-FN: An act relative to the natural right to carry a firearm, openly or concealed, without a license.

Provides that any person present in this state, and not incarcerated in a prison, jail, or other secure facility, or who is not otherwise prohibited from possessing a firearm under RSA 159:3, shall have the natural right to possess or carry, whether openly or concealed, or use, acquire, purchase, inherit, sell, give, dispose of, or receive any firearm without a license, permit, or restriction of any kind, from or by any government agency.

Establishes a CRIMINAL PENALTY for interference with the right to carry. Provides that obtaining a license to carry a pistol or revolver shall be voluntary, shall be granted to any suitable person, and shall only be denied, suspended, or

revoked upon proof of just cause beyond a reasonable doubt. Requires the director of the division of state police to NEGOTIATE and enter into agreements with other jurisdictions to recognize in those jurisdictions the validity of the license to carry issued in this state. Repeals the criminal penalty for selling, possessing with intent to sell, or carrying on one's person any BLACKJACK, SLUNG SHOT, or METALLIC KNUCKLES. Repeals the prohibition on carrying a pistol, revolver, firearm, or other deadly weapon in a COURTROOM or other area used by a COURT.

The potential flaws in this bill are also capitalized. Could you imagine government bureaucrats penalizing themselves and putting the burden of reciprocity on the director of the state police or judges facing armed defendants? Without the need of licensing where would the funding for negotiations come from?

There are good and bad points in both these bills. Committees will work on their language before any chance of a vote on the house floor.

From the political side of the fence:

We now have three organizations trumpeting firearms freedoms in the state of New Hampshire. There is the original one, <u>Gun Owners of New Hampshire</u>, <u>Inc.</u>, our state NRA affiliate organization. The <u>New Hampshire Firearms Coalition, Inc.</u> has been around for several years and we also have <u>Pro Gun New Hampshire</u>, <u>an</u> organization consisting of New Hampshire legislators, other public officials, and private citizens.

For the first time in memory we have as many organizations promoting legal firearm use as we have anti-gun groups trying to take away our firearms in this state. Unfortunately, since the legislative session began these three groups have worked independently of each other and in some cases have actually been in each others way regarding legislation. We seem to have a golden opportunity to have legislation passed that will protect our rights for generations to come in New Hampshire if these groups can agree that getting favorable firearms laws passed is more important than being the premiere pro-gun organization in our state.

Let's hope we don't have too much of a good thing in the state legislative arena.

The son of the late Michele and Vittoria (Paternoster) Polletta, Michael was born in Amesbury on 9 Oct 1932.
