## Cowboy Action Shooting Returns to CPF&G

### Howdy!

Cowboy Action Shooting (CAS) is all about dressin' up like folks did in the Old West and shootin' guns that were commonly used back then.

Targets are steel plates, and they're big and close, so expert marksmanship ain't necessary. We set targets so that every shooter, regardless of experience, can hit every single target. It's how quickly you hit 'em that makes the difference.

Our matches are pretty easy going. We don't try to compete so much as have a good time. Being safe and havin' fun are the two rules that we strictly enforce.

As far as dressin' up, we're not all that formal about it, but dressin' up is half the fun! All you really need is pair of jeans, a long-sleeved shirt, and boots. The only things that we really insist on are: no baseball-style caps, sneakers, short sleeve shirts, nylon or web gear, or Velcro. They just didn't have any of that stuff in the 1800s.

We use firearms that were available prior to 1899 - originals or replicas. You'll need two single-action six-guns, a lever-action rifle (in pistol caliber only), and a side-by-side double-barrel or exposed hammer pump shotgun.

Don't worry if you don't have the right guns, most of the regular shooters are willin' to lend firearms and ammo to new shooters, just so they can get the hang of it. That's how I got started in this. I didn't have any of the right gear, but one of the old cowhands loaned me a complete setup and I was hooked! A lot of us bring extra guns and ammo in case someone shows up and wants to try this game on for size.

To shoot a match at CPF&G, you'll need about 60 rounds each of pistol and rifle ammo, and 25 shotshells. Both rifle and pistol ammo must be pistol caliber (.45 Colt, .44 Special, 38 Special, etc.) lead bullets only - no jacketed or rifle caliber ammo allowed - and all ammo should be mild field or target loads. All shotshells must be size 7 ½ or smaller lead shot.

Our matches are divided into six "Stages". Each stage is a different course of fire, and has a "Scenario" to go with it. The scenario is a short storyline that explains why each stage is set up the way it is. A typical scenario might start out with "You're in the saloon when in walk two hombres with fire in their eyes..."

We shoot three stages, break for lunch, then shoot three more. The stages and

scenarios are different for each match and they're posted in advance on the Club website. Results are posted in the same place.

This year we'll host six CAS matches at CPF&G, with our first one on April 17th. Our remaining matches for 2011 will be held in May (our famous "All Ladies Shoot Free" Mother's Day Match), June, August, September, and October. Registration is from 10:30 to 11:45, followed by a mandatory safety meeting. The shootin' starts at High Noon, and we're usually done by 4:30 or so. The cost is \$5.00 for CPF&G Club Members, \$10.00 for non-members, and Juniors (under 16) always shoot for free.

Our matches at CPF&G are a great way to experience what CAS is all about. Once you've tried it you'll be hooked! The folks are friendly and, no matter what your skill level, you're welcome to come join us! Come on down and be an Old West cowboy or cowgirl for the day. You'll have a ball.





## NH Politics & Legislation

"The House Criminal Justice and Public Safety Committee voted 11-6 in favor of *HB 330*. The bill would make New Hampshire an open carry state, allowing anyone to carry a firearm without a concealed-weapons permit. The bill also would allow a person to have firearms while in or on a vehicle. The measure would not override other laws that ban weapons from public schools, restrict who may possess a weapon, or govern hunting."

- New Hampshire Union Leader, Sunday 13 March 2011 The Bill subsequently was passed by the House and will go on to the Senate.

Proposed legislation heard by the Criminal Justice and Public Safety Committee:

HB 572-FN, relative to the act of official oppression was voted 9-5 ought to pass (OTP). This bill, clarifying conditions under which official oppression may be charged. In keeping with Art.8, Part 1 of the NH Constitution, this bill increases the accountability of public servants (i.e. Police) in the exercise of their official duties.

HB 225-FN, relative to the return of personal property confiscated by law enforcement agencies from a person charged with a crime was voted 14-2 inexpedient to legislate (ITL). This bill requires the prompt return of confiscated property. Rights of the people come first, not the convenience of the police. People should not lose their property because of malicious or erroneous accusations. This bill should generate a floor fight when it comes up for a vote. The committee's recommendation carries a lot of weight. If you have ever had

to deal with the police to get confiscated property returned after there has been a judicial judgment in your favor, you can understand the importance of this proposed legislation. This bill passed the House on a floor vote with an amendment. The amendment is being scrutinized by the legislative committee of GONH to ascertain that the language will not be adverse to the gist of the bill.

We do have a pro-firearm legislature but a lot of them are freshmen in the NH House and are learning that politics even in the Granite State has its share of "snakes" in the grass.

"HB 330 – This bill still needs work. The bill's all encompassing "notwithstanding" language is overdone ... makes NH law confusing and unclear. This arguably ends hunting and target shooting for 16 to 18 year olds. They will still have to get a LTC (doubtful they will ever be issued if this passes) for self-defense. We will still need a LTC if we ride snowmobiles and OHRVs. What about motorcycles that are on and off road? Are they vehicles under NH law when off the road? Otherwise law-abiding NH residents will be at risk if this passes."

"Who has read federal law, 18 USC sub 922? It's as confusing as IRS code and clear as mud. We are trying to pass "made in NH firearms" laws and a pro firearm legislature wants to tie us to Federal law that can change any time out of our NH control."
