## Club Bylaw Changes

Sections 3.1 and 3.6 of the Country Pond Fish & Game Club Bylaws have been changed. These changes are effective immediately.

These Bylaw sections now read:

- 3.1 An individual interested in membership shall submit an application for membership to the Vice President, then be interviewed by the membership Committee.
- Each prospective new Member must be sponsored by a current Club Member in good standing.
- b. Any Sponsor must have been a Club Member in good standing for at least two complete years immediately prior to sponsoring any new Member.
- Any couple joining as Family Members at the same time need only a single sponsor.
- d. If the prospective Member or Members are accepted as CPF&G Club Members, the Sponsor will share complete responsibility for the new Member's actions for one year.
- e. This section shall not apply to Honorary Members
- 3.6 Senior Member
- a. Must be a dues paying member for five (5) consecutive years;
- Will be a voting member with full Club privileges and be exempt from dues and any other charges assessed the membership; and
- c. Must be sixty-five (65) years old and voted into Senior membership at any regular meeting after the member's sixty fifth birthday, as requested by the member.

- Empty the powder measure when done loading or you'll forget what's in it.
- Before you go and load a whole bunch of ammo, load just five and try them out.
- Make your own pet load chart. It beats having to remember (first mistake) or look up your load again and just maybe reading the wrong line (second mistake).
- Don't overdo crimping, it just crushes the case and you'll wonder why it won't chamber.
- NEVER, EVER, EVER mix powders. This practice is just stupid and proves that the factory really does know more than you.
- Hot loads aren't funny. If your cases won't eject, extract, or the cases split or blow out primers, BACK OFF ON THE POWDER BEFORE YOU GET SOMEBODY KILLED.
- Bullet pullers are worth their weight in

The Family Membership Initiation Fee and Annual Dues for the couple will be set at 150% of those charged for individual Regular Members.



## gold compared to thrown away



- Check your scale for level every time you use it. You can be off .2-.5 grains and not even know it.
- Maximum loads usually aren't the most accurate. About half way between minimum and max works the best for almost all powders.
- If the load manual calls for a powder with an H before the number, that is a Hodgdon powder, not IMR. Example: H4895 is Hodgdon, 4895 is IMR
- Drinking and loading do not mix. Actually, absolutely nothing mixes with loading. You need to concentrate on what you're doing. If you do other things while you load, please inform the shooters around you so they can find a safe place to hide until you leave.
- No two loading manuals will agree on a particular load. It's confusing, but that's just the way it is.






- If you load on a Dillon 550, the best way to temporarily stop loading for any reason - answering the phone, visiting the head, whatever - is to stop with the handle in the down position. That way, you'll know just where you are when you return.
- Don't replace one bullet weight with a heavier one and use the same powder charge. Sounds like common sense but I have known more than one person who ruined a gun by doing it. Pressure is calculated in the manuals. Changing anything changes everything.
- Use a LEE Factory Crimp Die. I talked to a friend one day and bought one for 44 Magnum. It turned 2" groups at 50 yards into 1" groups. It really works. I have since bought them for all calibers I reload. My 30-06 is a Remington 7400 and I shoot 1" groups at 100 yards after using this crimp die.
