

Indoor Pistol Range Backstop Reconstruction Project

May 28th marked the beginning of the new Indoor Pistol Range Backstop Project. Phase I was building the base structure, which took several days, and Phase II, slated for June 1st, involved hauling the rubber media into the range and getting it all installed. That day dawned hot and muggy, but quite a few Club Members showed up to lend a hand getting the job done. With all the help on hand, the task was completed in less than five hours.

The splatter board previously located at the base of the backstop is gone, so the new target rules are: Use only the Club provided hangers - black hangers from 25' to 50' and red hangers at shorter ranges - and use only paper targets no larger than 21" by 21".

You're welcome to check out the new backstop when it's safe to do so, but under no circumstances should anyone walk on it. KEEP OFF is the rule.

Caliber restrictions have been changed. Under the new rule, any rimfire ammo, including, but not limited to, .22WMR, .17 HM2, and .17HMR, is allowed, but only when fired from a handgun. Rifles and carbines are still limited to .22 Short, Long, or Long Rifle only.

If you use the Indoor Pistol Range at all, these are the people you can thank for making it possible.


History and Development of the US 30.06 Service Cartridge

With the adoption of the M1903 rifle, a new cartridge was also adopted. The cartridge designed for the rifle featured a rimless bottlenecked case, and a round nosed 220 grain bullet, advertised at 2,300 feet per second muzzle velocity.

In 1906, the United States adopted a lighter spitzer bullet of 150 grains and a muzzle velocity of 2,700 feet per second. The maximum range for the new cartridge, now designated the M1906, was found to be between 3,300 and 3,400 yards, with the muzzle of the rifle at an angle between 29 and 45 degrees.

In 1917, the United States declared war on Germany and entered World War I. At the outset of the war, the United States had virtually no machine guns, so troops in France were armed with British Vickers guns, and with French Hotchkiss guns. The Vickers gun fired the .303 Mk VII round, a 174 grain flat based bullet, and the Hotchkiss used the 198 grain Balle D spitzer boattailed bullet. It didn't take long for the US machine gun crews to realize that these rounds had extreme ranges nearly fifty percent greater than the M1906. When the US troops were finally issued American Browning machine guns, they were appalled to learn that they could no longer lay machine gun barrages at the same long range as

This failing of the M1906 cartridge led to a search for a new service bullet in the period immediately following the war. During the development process, US Army Ordnance personnel tested the contemporary Swiss service bullet used in the Swiss Army's Schmidt-Rubin M1911 and M1896/11 rifles. This bullet was a 174 grain boattailed design of the same diameter of the M1906 loading: .308". The tests revealed that



the Swiss bullet was immensely superior to the M1906 with respect to long range performance.

As a result of the tests, a 174 grain bullet with a 9 degree boat tail taper and an ogive of 7 calibers in radius was adopted as the .30 caliber M1 in 1925. Muzzle velocity of rounds loaded with the M1 bullet was 2,640 feet per second, giving an extreme range of 5,500 yards.

In 1925, when the new M1 round was standardized, there were two billion .30-06 rounds in store. The Army's policy at the time was to use the oldest ammunition first, keeping the newest supply for war reserve. These two billion rounds were finally expended in 1936, and only then was the M1 ammunition issued in bulk for training. Upon the issuance of the Ml ammunition, there was an alarming realization - the MI ammunition had so much more range and momentum than the M1906 ammunition that it began to shoot beyond the impact zones of existing ranges! The National Guard Bureau (NGB) then asked the War Department to make up a batch of ten million rounds with the same characteristics as the old M1906 round.

The "new" short range ammunition was virtually a clone of the M1906 round. It

used a 150 grain flat based bullet, but the ogive was shaped like that of the M1. By the late 1930's, this "new" ammunition had reached the service evaluation boards (by now minus all the old World War One machine gunners who had so keenly felt the lack of range in the original M1906 round). The new round had lower recoil than the M1, and more rounds could be carried for a given weight of ammunition, so in 1940, the new round (with a bullet weight of 152 grains owing to a slightly different lead alloy) was standardized as the Cartridge, Ball, Caliber .30, M2. The M2 cartridge boasted a muzzle velocity of 2,805 feet per second. The armor piercing analog to the M2, the Cartridge, Armor Piercing, Caliber .30, M2 fires a 168 grain bullet at 2,775 feet per second muzzle velocity.

The story did not end there, however. The 1936 - 1940 period, when the M2 cartridge was being standardized, was the same time frame that the M1 Garand rifle was coming into service. The change in service ammunition led to unfounded and false accusations that the new rifle couldn't handle the M1 ammunition. This was, of course, totally false, the reasons for the change having to do with size of the then existing training ranges.

Politics & Legislation

Summer is the time for sun and fun. You also have to keep in mind our politicians are still around thinking up new ways to protect us from ourselves. More often than not we need protection from our politicians.

As I researched and wrote this article, the US Senate narrowly passed a measure that will stop the United States from entering into the United Nations Arms Trade Treaty. The statement of purpose from the bill read: "To uphold Second Amendment rights and prevent the United States from entering into the United Nations Arms Trade Treaty." The sad part of this situation is that it passed by a vote of 53 to 46. In plain English we had 46 Senators who voted to comply with this UN attack on our Constitutional rights. The treaty will go to President Obama which he will sign and then it will go to the Senate for ratification. For the record the 46 Senators who are willing to hand over control of our country to a foreign organization are all Democrats.

We have all witnessed over the years what a great job the UN has done

around the world. Do we really want this organization of pygmies dictating to us how to live our lives and what rights we can or cannot exercise under our Constitution? I think not. At least I hope not.

On the local front in the Granite State our state Senate killed a bill that would have granted immunity to gun owners whose weapons are stolen and then used in a crime. House Bill 388 passed the House on a 211-151 vote after a committee recommendation to kill the bill was overturned on 192-167 vote.

The Senate Judiciary Committee said the bill would have been more restrictive than current case law rather than protect gun owners. (Union Leader 5-31-2013 page A3)

There was a "No More Names" rally in front of the New Hampshire statehouse on 18 June 2013. This is a paid group touring the New England area sponsored by Mayor Bloomberg of New York City fame. They travel in a bus paid for by Bloomberg's Mayors Against Gun Violence. These folks have been standing in front of town halls,

statehouses and where ever they can get a permit to conduct their activities and reading the names of six thousand plus shooting victims since the Boston Marathon bombing. Our state organization, Gun Owners of N.H., plus other pro-firearms groups, were there to counter their rally. I have called into question the list of names they use since the inception of this politically motivated group. Seems we cannot obtain a copy of this list. As reported by WMUR television on 19 June 2013, one of the names spoken by these outstanding citizens was one of the Boston Marathon bombers. The group apologized for the "mistake". Some of the names listed were "name unknown" shot on such and such date. The validity of this list has been questioned by many and we have not been able to verify the circumstances of some of these shootings. This is a prime example of what the anti-gun groups are willing to do to further their misguided cause.

A citizen pro-gun activist had a confrontation with one of the anti-gun activist and was approached by a Bloomberg paid security man. They had words and the next thing I saw were several Concord police cruisers, lights and sirens screaming, approaching the statehouse. Three policemen surrounded this individual and he tried to explain his side of the story. The officers attempted to handcuff this individual and he made the mistake of resisting. Final outcome was six policemen were in this individuals face and they Tasered him into submission and handcuffed him. Last I saw of him was in a cruiser.

Unfortunately this guy played right into their hands and they received more press coverage than they hoped for. We want all the gun owners in our state to participate in protecting our firearms rights. You have to be careful and smart. We are up against professionals that know how to get media attention.
