

Politics & Legislation

The United Nations has been very busy regarding worldwide gun control. In the past most bills involving firearms and the right to keep and possess firearms could be researched by key words such as firearms, etc. These bills usually came out of Criminal Justice and Safety Committees, but lately we have monitored bills affecting firearm use and ownership coming from many different committees. They are using the Washington DC mantras of violence prevention, public school safety, mental stability, and more. The directors and some members of Gun Owners of NH spend many hours reading these LSR's and consulting their legal counsel about the threat some of these pose to our firearms

GOAL (Gun Owners Action League) of Massachusetts is working diligently to protect what firearms rights our Massachusetts members still have and to repeal some of the draconian laws on the books. The organization was there in force at the last Bill of Rights hearing that was held at the Gardner Auditorium in Boston this month. They have not published a report about the results of the hearing. In the July issue of "The GOAL News" they enumerated the 33 steps necessary to legally purchase a firearm in Massachusetts. After reading what these folks have to go through to purchase a firearm, it made me appreciate what we have here in NH. Even with all the faults we can find with our politicians they are angels compared to our southern neighbors' legislators.


