Politics & Legislation

After my report last month on SB244, our august legislators have separated the two sections of the bill, making this proposed legislation very different from what the GONH officers and others had worked diligently on, to show our legislators we are willing to work together to write and pass legislation that protects our rights and solves problems. Once again, political posturing and partisan politics defeated our efforts. The committee that was supposed to review and expand legal use of firearms was sacrificed at the altar of "political correctness".

As originally proposed, SB244 would have required the names of people with court-determined mental illness to be added to the federal "prohibited from purchasing guns" list. Under the bill, those prohibited from possessing guns because of mental illness would be able to use an annulment procedure that could lead to their names being removed from the prohibited list. Today, the annulment procedure is all that remains of the bill. (Source – NH Sunday News, April 6, 2014 page B9)

Some proponents of establishing an annulment process to expunge mental health records believe it should not be tied to gun rights. Law enforcement and several gun rights groups said the bill the Senate approved would not do what supporters contend it would do. "This is a bridge that goes nowhere," said Deputy Dept. of Safety Commissioner Earl Sweeney. "This bill does not give the relief they think it gives them." Others argued the annulment process is needed to end the stigmatization of the mentally ill, although many agreed SB244 would need significant changes to be viable. This situation should give some insight to our members and the general public into the process that occurs trying to get legislation passed that will benefit firearms enthusiasts and to maintain the civil rights of law-abiding citizens. The political process is more than frustrating when the politico's main concern is future elections and maintaining or achieving a political majority.

Members Monthly Meeting 15 May 19:00

On the federal level: Some good news, for now.

No background check expansion bill will reach senate floor. US Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV) has said that any legislation to expand the current National Instant Criminal Background Check System (NICS) will not be considered on the Senate floor following Wednesday's shooting involving an apparently mentally unstable soldier at Fort Hood in Texas. Though Reid pledged last year to bring gun-control legislation back to the floor, he said there are insufficient votes for passage and he won't move a bill until he can count enough positive votes. Reid understands that any vote to expand background checks would pose a huge political problem for vulnerable red-state Democrats seeking re-election this year.

To those of you who may be considering Scott Brown for the US Senate, I urge you to check out his voting record while he was the Senator from The People's Republic of Taxachusetts. Of special interest to NH residents and firearms owners is his position on the "Assault Weapons" ban. His record on other civil rights is not a stellar example of what most of us consider conservative ideals.

H.L. Mencken (born 1880 - died 1956) was a journalist, satirist, critic, and Democrat. He wrote this editorial while working for the Baltimore Evening Sun, which appeared in the July 26, 1920 edition.

"As democracy is perfected, the office of the President represents, more and more closely, the inner soul of the people. On some great and glorious day, the plain folks of the land will reach their heart's desire at last and the White House will be occupied by a downright fool and complete narcissistic moron."

Cowboy Action Shooting Returns to CPF&G

Howdy!

Cowboy Action Shooting (CAS) is all about dressin' up like folks did in the Old West and shootin' guns that were commonly used back then.

Targets are steel plates, and they're big and close, so expert marksmanship ain't necessary. We set targets so that every shooter, regardless of experience, can hit every single target. It's how quickly you hit 'em that makes the difference.

Our matches are pretty easy going. We don't try to compete so much as have a good time. Being safe and havin' fun are the two rules that we strictly enforce.

As far as dressin' up, we're not all that formal about it, but dressin' up is half the fun! All you really need is pair of jeans, a long-sleeved shirt, and boots. The only things that we really insist on are: no baseball-style caps, sneakers, short sleeve shirts, nylon or web gear, or Velcro. They just didn't have any of that stuff in the 1800s.

We use firearms that were available prior to 1899 - originals or replicas. You'll need two single-action six-guns, a lever-action rifle (in pistol caliber only), and a side-by-side double-barrel or exposed hammer pump shotgun.

Don't worry if you don't have the right guns, most of the regular shooters are willin' to lend firearms and ammo to new shooters, just so they can get the hang of it. That's how I got started in this. I didn't have any of the right gear, but one of the old cowhands loaned me a complete setup and I was hooked! A lot of us bring extra guns and ammo in case someone shows up and wants to try this game on for size.

To shoot a match at CPF&G, you'll need about 60 rounds each of pistol and rifle ammo, and 25 shotshells. Both rifle and pistol ammo must be pistol caliber (.45 Colt, .44 Special, 38 Special, etc.) lead bullets only - no jacketed or rifle caliber ammo allowed - and all ammo should be mild field or target loads. All shotshells must be size 7 ½ or smaller lead shot.

Our matches consist of six "Stages". Each stage is a different course of fire, and has a "Scenario" - a short storyline that explains why each stage is set up the way it is - to go with it. A typical scenario might start out with "You're in the saloon when in walk two hombres with fire in their eyes..."

We shoot three stages, break for lunch,

then shoot three more. Stages and scenarios are different for each match and are posted in advance on the Club website. Results are posted later.

This year we'll host four CAS matches at CPF&G, with the first one being our famous "All Ladies Shoot Free" Mother's Day Match, followed by matches in June, August, and October. Registration is from 10:30 to 11:45, followed by a mandatory safety meeting. The shootin' starts at High Noon, and we're usually done by 4:00 or so. The cost is \$5.00 for CPF&G Club Members, \$10.00 for nonmembers, and Juniors (under 16) always shoot for free.

Our matches at CPF&G are a great way to experience what CAS is all about. Once you've tried it you'll be hooked! The folks are friendly and, no matter what your skill level, you're welcome to come join us! LEGAL NOTICE

Proposed Club Bylaw Change

At the next monthly Members meeting, to be held on 15 May, the following changes to Bylaw 3.7 will be voted on. Reason: to correct errors.

- 3.7 Life Member
- a. Any member in good standing may apply for an individual Life Membership. Family Members-A Married Couple in good standing may apply for Family Married Couple Life Membership.
- b. A maximum of one hundred (100) Life Memberships will be available. For the purpose of this rule, a Family Married Couple Membership shall count as two Life Memberships.
- c. Life memberships will be granted on a first come, first served, basis.
- d. The cost for Life Membership shall be set as follows:
- (1) Individual Life Membership if the member is under 40 years of age: 12.5 times the existing Regular Annual Membership cost, rounded up to the nearest \$10 (ten dollars).
- (2) Individual Life Membership if the member is 40 years of age or over: 10 times the existing Regular Annual Membership cost, rounded up to the nearest \$10 (ten dollars).
- (3) Family Married Couple Life Membership if the average of the Members' ages is under 40: 12.5 times the existing Family Married Couple Annual Membership cost, rounded up to the nearest \$10 (ten dollars).
- (4) Family Married Couple Life Membership if the average of the Members' ages is 40 or over: 10 times the existing Family Married Couple Annual Membership cost, rounded up to the nearest \$10 (ten dollars).
