





Proposed CPF&G Club Bylaw Changes

As prescribed under Article X of the Bylaws of the Country Pond Fish & Game Club, Inc., notice is hereby given of proposed amendments to said Bylaws. A vote on the below described changes shall take place at the next general meeting.

Article V: Committees and Club Leagues

Article 5.7, which currently reads:

The committee or league **should** give a summary of all committee or league action at all monthly meetings.

to be changed to read:

The committee or league **shall** give a summary of all committee or league action at all monthly meetings.

Article 5.9, which currently reads:

Before payment, all approved bills shall submitted to the Treasurer, who will make payment of said bills. The Treasurer shall be the only party authorized to make the aforementioned disbursements.

to be changed to read:

Before payment, all approved bills shall **be** submitted to the **Club** Treasurer, who will make payment of said bills. The Treasurer shall be the only party authorized to make the aforementioned disbursements.

Article 5.10 a, which currently reads:

Leagues shall consist of a **group of teams** organized for the purpose of competition within the Club.

to be changed to read:

Leagues shall consist of a **group of Club Members, who may be organized into teams**, for the purpose of competition within the Club.

Article 5.10 c, which currently reads:

Competition records and scores shall be retained by the League **Coordinator**.

to be changed to read:

Competition records and scores shall be retained by the League **Chairman or Secretary, until such time as they are submitted to the Club Historian. The Club Historian shall ensure that all records are retained, either in hard copy or electronically, for a period of not less than five years.**

Article 5.10 d, which currently reads:

The League Secretary **and Coordinator** shall be elected by the members of the League.

to be changed to read:

The League Secretary shall be elected by the members of the League.

To add Article 5.10 g:

Minor children, wards, or grandchildren of Club Members may participate in Club Leagues, but only if a majority of the League Members vote to allow it. Minors other than the above are prohibited from Club League participation. Any minor must be accompanied by a parent or guardian at all times. Liability Waivers signed by the parent or guardian are required.



Guidelines for a Gunfight

There are no real "rules", other than "Win!", but these are some suggestions from various Concealed Carry Instructors. If you own a gun, you will appreciate these rules. If not, you may want to get one, learn how to use it and learn the rules.

Always keep in mind...

- that it's better to be judged by twelve than carried by six;
- that the average response time of a 911 call is 23 minutes; the response time of a .357 Magnum is 1,350 feet per second;
- that in ten years nobody will remember the details of caliber, stance, or tactics. They will only remember who lived; and
- that cops carry guns to protect themselves, not you.

BEFORE:

Have a plan.

Have a back-up plan, because the first one won't work. You can't save the planet, but you may be able to save yourself and your family.

If you expect to be in a gunfight somewhere, be smart. Don't go there. Only a dumbass goes looking for trouble.

Have a gun with you. Preferably, have at least two guns with you and several friends who have guns with them.

Decide to be aggressive ENOUGH, quickly ENOUGH.

Don't drop your guard.

Watch their hands. Hands kill. (In God we trust. Everyone else, keep your hands where I can see them.)

Accuracy is relative: most combat shooting standards will be more dependent on "pucker factor" than the inherent accuracy of the gun. Just have a gun that works every time.

Your number one option for personal security is a lifelong commitment to avoidance, deterrence, and de-escalation.

Be courteous to everyone, friendly to no one.

Be polite. Be professional. But, have a plan to kill everyone you meet.

Someday someone may try to kill you. Make your attacker advance through a wall of bullets. You may get killed with your own gun, but they should have to beat you to death with it because it is empty.

Never let anyone or anything that threatens you get within arm's length.

Never say "I've got a gun." If you need to use deadly force, the first sound they should hear is the safety clicking off or the hammer cocking.

You can say "Stop" or any other word, but a large bore muzzle pointed at someone's head is pretty much a universal language; and you won't have to press 1 for Spanish, 2 for Chinese, or 3 for Arabic.

DURING:

Anything worth shooting is worth shooting twice. Ammo is cheap – life is expensive.

Only hits count. The only thing worse than a miss is a slow miss.

You can't miss fast enough to win.

If you are not shooting, you should be loading; If you're not loading, you should be moving; If you're not moving, you're probably dead.

Use cover or concealment as much as possible.

If your shooting stance is good, you're probably not moving fast enough or using cover correctly.

Flank your adversary when possible. Protect yours.

Always tactical load and threat scan 360 degrees.

Move away from your attacker. Distance is your friend. (Lateral and diagonal movement are preferred.)

Do not shoot a large caliber man (or woman) with a small caliber weapon.

Always cheat, always win. The only unfair fight is the one you lose. Second place doesn't count.

The faster you finish the fight, the less shot you will get.

In a life and death situation, do something... it may be the wrong thing, but do something!

AFTER:

If you've been in a gunfight, don't talk to anyone (especially reporters or the police) without your lawyer present. If you just have to say something, (and you really shouldn't) try "I'm sorry, but I feel too shaken up to make a coherent statement at this time."

Politics & Legislation

Some good and some not so good things have been happening under the Concord golden dome:

HB650: a bill requiring background checks for commercial firearms sales. This already exists on the state and federal level. So why was this bill introduced? The answer is in the wording. The way this bill was presented, it would have made all firearms sales and transfers commercial firearms sales, thus requiring background checks for all firearms. So the firearm you leave to loved ones or the gun you let your brother borrow could put you in jail for noncompliance. This bill was reported ITL (Inexpedient To Legislate), killing the bill for this session.

HB685: a bill prohibiting a state agency, state employee, or political subdivision from enforcing any federal law regarding a firearm, firearm accessory, or ammunition. This bill was also judged ITL.

HB512: a bill prohibiting confiscation of firearms, ammunition, or firearms accessories during a state of emergency. This bill inserts specific penalty provisions to be applied against any law enforcement officer who confiscates a firearm, firearm accessory, ammunition, or ammunition

component during a declared state of emergency. The intent of this bill is to put teeth in the existing law that was passed several years ago. This bill was also retained in committee. At least they didn't kill it for the session.

HB582: a bill repealing the requirement for a license to carry a pistol or revolver concealed. This bill was retained in committee which is tabling the bill. It could be brought back at any time

SB116: The Constitutional Carry Bill. This important legislation passed the New Hampshire Senate on February 12. It is now being considered by the House of Representatives. SB116 is the identical twin of HB582. There is a hearing scheduled for Tuesday, March 24 at 10:00AM in the Legislative Office Building, Rooms 206-207. If you can attend this hearing to support this bill, please do so. Hopefully they won't play any political games (like postponing or rescheduling the hearing) and we can get this to the Governor's desk before the end of this session. SB116 repeals

RSA 159:4, which requires a person to have a license to carry a concealed and loaded pistol or revolver, and it modifies and leaves in place RSA 159:6 which allows people to obtain a license. This is important for those firearms owners who travel, because the New Hampshire Pistol/Revolver license is currently valid in 22 states.

Many pro-gun activists have invested a lot of time and effort to get firearm friendly legislation introduced and passed in this current legislative session. We are driving toward the finish line with the pro-firearms laws we have fought for. A large show of voters at the hearings will help in achieving what we all want. This last push is to get the legislation on the Governor's desk. She can either veto the legislation, sign the legislation into law, or not sign it. The bill would become law at the end of the session if she does not sign it. Our Governor has higher political ambitions and is being very cautious about her actions. Who knows what will happen.






