

Why 3-Gun?





3-Gun is probably the most practical, useful, and adrenaline filled sport in the gun world today. The three guns it uses are the pistol (semi-automatic), the rifle (typically an AR-15), and the shotgun (pump or semi-auto).

It puts the participant in the position of having to shoot on the move, in a hurry, with multiple guns, in an obstacle course style race format.

Its hard to imagine a more useful way to train civilians to be prepared for a situation in which they may need to use a firearm to defend themselves or their family. 3-Gun competitions use the weapons that a person would most likely use in a self defense situation and simultaneously put the shooter under the pressure of a time constraint by making the competition a race.

When you're in a race, your adrenaline flows like crazy. Your fingers shake, you forget to disengage your safety, and you miss targets that would have otherwise been easy, because you're in such a rush and so pumped with adrenaline.

This is exactly what makes 3-Gun so important and useful. If someone breaks into your house in the middle of the night, do you think they're going to wait while you load your pistol, take aim, disengage the safety, and fire slow

well aimed shots? Of course not. You're going to be in the biggest rush of your life and your adrenaline is going to explode as you attempt to take action to save your family. This is when the quality of your training will show.

If you have never shot outside of slow paced, calm range shooting or hunting, you're going to be ill-prepared for a life or death engagement. You'll probably freeze up and make multiple deadly mistakes when it matters most.

If, on the other hand, you've repeatedly put yourself into training situations that require you to rush, that cause your adrenaline to pump, and that make you shoot fast and accurately, your body will do what its been trained to do through those previous training experiences. This is called muscle memory and it's the key to performing in stressful situations. When you are in a fight or flight mode, your conscious mind turns off and your body simply actsa. Unless it's been trained to act in a certain way for such a situation, it will fail to do so. You don't have time to think through your decisions in a life or death emergency situation.

Many aspects of 3-Gun will be new to you when you first start out, such as:

shooting while experiencing a major

adrenaline rush

- shooting rapid double taps
- shooting at multiple targets one after another as quickly as possible
- shooting close and far targets in rapid sequence
- safely switching weapons rapidly
- shooting on the move
- reloading rapidly under pressure

When you enter your first 3-Gun competition, you'll get to experience just how badly such a life or death situation would have gone without the proper training. You'll find yourself dropping magazines, forgetting to disengage the safety of your weapon, failing to quickly clear simple jams, missing shots that would normally be easy for you, taking what seems like an eternity to load another magazine, etc. This is how everyone starts out when they first enter the world of real time, real scenario shooting. There are always several competitors at every 3-Gun competition who are first-timers and who make more mistakes than you could imagine. No one will laugh at you. We're all here for the same reason: to get good; really good. You'll find expert 3-Gunners will cheerfully give you advice and tips on procedures, techniques, and equipment.
