

## Steel Targets and Stands at CPF&G Club

Most members know that steel targets are permitted at CPF&G Club as long as the targets, their placement, and their use are in accordance with CPF&G Range Rules. For general shooting practice, steel targets are much more fun than paper targets because of the sound they produce when hit. The audible feedback also eliminates the need for a spotting scope to determine whether the target was hit.

What many members may not know is that the Club now has permanent stands for steel targets installed at the 25 yd, 50 yd, and 100 yd berms. Next time you are downrange, take a look at the black 2" x 4" rectangular receiving tubes near the target stands. Currently there are two stands at 25 yds, two at 50 yds, and three at 100 yds (on the left side). One or two more stands are planned for the right side at 100 yds this spring.



These tubes are designed to accept a common 2x4 to support a steel target. Members need only bring their 4' long 2x4 and (conforming) steel target, set it in the receiving tube, and they are good to go. Sure beats carrying a target stand back and forth from home to the target area.



Also, members can store their 2x4's on the table behind the 50 yd berm so the only item that a member must bring to the club is the target itself. Put your name and member number on the 2x4 so no one else uses it. Please, when your 2x4 has expired from too many hits, put it on the burn pile behind the 50 yd berm, do not put it in a trash can, in the dumpster or leave it on the range.

Please note that these permanently installed target holders are designed to be used with single targets that sit on a 2x4, they are not intended to be used with targets that hang by chains or straps. If you have gongs that hang by chains and straps, you will need to bring your own hanging system.



#### Pistol vs Rifle

Steel targets may be used at the 25 yd berm only with PISTOL CALIBERS! This means that almost anything you shoot from a handgun plus Pistol Caliber Carbines (PCC) in common pistol calibers are acceptable. PCCs using 9mm, 10mm, .357, .45 ACP, .45 Colt, etc. are acceptable. As far as handguns, please do not use rifle calibers in "handguns" such as the Contender, AR pistols, and the like. All rifle calibers must be used at a minimum distance of 50 yds regardless of the type of gun used.

### Steel Targets and Ammunition

Quality steel targets are made from AR500, a steel alloy hardened to Brinell hardness of 500. Steel this hard cannot be cut or machined by conventional means, it is much too hard to saw, mill, or drill. AR500 targets will last almost forever when used with pistol calibers. AR500 targets will last a lifetime for most people, as long as they do not use magnum rifle calibers, ammo that has bullets containing steel, or are shot at short range.

Most people know that "green tip" AR-15 ammo (M855 and SS109) has a hardened steel penetrator in the tip of the bullet. Many people may not realize that most of the inexpensive rifle ammo in military calibers has steel in the bullet. Rifle ammo such as Wolf, Tula, Brown Bear, Silver Bear, etc. not only have steel cases, but also have steel jacketed bullets (sometimes referred to as "bimetal"). The bullets have a thin copper plate (sometimes called copper "flash") on the order of .0002" thick on the steel jacket. This thin copper plating gives the deceptive appearance that the bullet is conventional copper jacketed lead. These bullets will damage a steel target about as much as a M855 with steel penetrator. If you are not sure what you have, put the bullet to a magnet.

Shooting steel bullets at AR500 will shorten target life, but the targets but will still last for years. Personally, I avoid steel bullets, not only because they are hard on targets, but are also hard on barrels.

## Steel Plate Target Etiquette

If you are at the range and see a steel target, do not shoot it unless you have the owner's permission. All steel targets (other than those used at club events such as 3-Gun) are privately owned. If you arrive at the range and see one, the owner is



nearby. Shooting a target you do not own is akin to picking up someone's gun and shooting it. If you ask permission, most people will allow you to shoot their steel target, so long as you do not abuse it. For example, some people may not want steel jacketed or steel penetrator ammo, or magnum calibers used on their targets. It is a matter of simply respecting the property of others.

## Where You Can Get Compatible Targets


Billionaires are financing student protests across the country. High school students went from the "Tide Pod" challenge to being Constitutional experts overnight.
