# **Hunting Late Season Deer**

While it has been a successful deer season for some, many of us have been watching December creep closer with a wallet full of deer tags burning a hole in our pockets. When times get desperate, there are a few tricks that just might help you tag at whitetail this winter.

#### 1: Food Sources

As the autumn acorns are depleted, deer will begin to switch to their winter forage. This primarily consists of evergreens, shrubs, and soft sapling twigs. Deer are likely to be found along field edges, on open, south-facing slopes, in swamps and brambles, or other areas where increased sunlight allows for this younger growth vegetation to flourish. Open areas where this forage can be found are also sunny and warm, which can attract deer as the days get colder. Even as winter sets in, acorns remain a premier food source for deer. Taking the time to find large oak stands where there are still acorns among the leaf-litter may serve you well.

#### 2: Habitat

Winter brings with it cold winds and blustery storms. During especially cold and windy days, deer will seek low-lying ground and stick to the sheltered sides of hills. Hunting swamps, creek beds, and other areas that are protected from the weather can be quite effective. Important areas to seek out are also woods with good thermal cover. Thermal cover can include dense pine forests or laurel patches that trap heat throughout the day. Microclimates of warm air will attract deer, and should therefore also attract your attention.

As the season wears on, it is also beneficial to find areas with lower hunting pressure. Here in southern New Hampshire, this may mean getting creative with access to some forgotten patch of woods or asking around the neighborhood for permission to hunt someone's back acreage. If you are willing to travel, you may also consider heading farther into large patches of woods. While you will have to be prepared for a long drag if you do drop a deer, taking the road less traveled is likely to lead

you to the herds that have been pushed out of their usual stomping grounds by other, less ambitious, hunters.

#### 3: Deer Drives

When the going gets tough, the weak do a deer drive. This controversial method of hunting deer is, also, quite effective. If you can't convince the deer to come to you, maybe you can convince a friend to flush some deer in your direction. While driving deer works throughout the season, it is a handy tactic when the season gets short. Just wear plenty of hunter-orange and be absolutely sure of your target and what is behind it while hunting this way. If anyone wants to argue that driving deer is not traditional or sporting, then direct their attention to the traditional hunting methods used by ancient people around the world, especially here in North America. Driving game into a designated area is as traditional as hunting gets.

#### 4: Hunt Other States

For some inexplicable reason, the Massachusetts deer season is just kicking off as New Hampshire's season comes to a close. If you finish out the New Hampshire season without any venison in the freezer, venturing over the boarder will at least give you a second chance at success.
